If you are making contributions through the envelope system your new set can be collected from the Monastery after making arrangements with Denise or Gail during office hours on 6234 4866. For record keeping purposes we will allocate you the envelope number that you are currently using for this financial year. This will enable us to issue receipts at the end of each financial year to those people who have provided us with their name and address. We have several anonymous contributors who ideally need a number so that we can accurately declare the number of people contributing to our parish finances. People who have started internet banking can continue to do so using their current envelope number as we will withdraw that set from general circulation. This enables you to use the envelopes if you choose to do so in the future.

THE 2020 PARISH FAIR: Regrettably the decision has been taken by the Parish Pastoral Council in consultation with the St Joseph's clerical community and our regular Fair contributors to cancel this year's Parish Fair. Although many communal event restrictions are starting to be lifted, it was felt that our capacity to guarantee the continuing health and well-being of our broad but ageing community would be compromised by continuing with the event, especially given the confined space of Legacy Hall and the virtual impossibility of ensuring any sort of social distancing within such a venue.

But all is not lost. The **2020 Raffle** will still **go ahead** - once Mass attendances increase.
