If you are making contributions through the envelope system your new set can be collected from the Monastery after making arrangements with Denise or Gail during office hours on 6234 4866.** For record keeping purposes we will allocate you the envelope number that you are currently using for this financial year. This will enable us to issue receipts at the end of each financial year to those people who have provided us with their name and address. We have several anonymous contributors who ideally need a number so that we can accurately declare the number of people contributing to our parish finances. People who have started internet banking can continue to do so using their current envelope number as we will withdraw that set from general circulation. This enables you to use the envelopes if you choose to do so in the future.

**PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING this Tuesday the 20<sup>th</sup> April at 7pm in the Side Chapel.**

**PREPARATION DAY FOR THE PLENARY COUNCIL:** In 2018, a decision was made to hold a Plenary Council in Australia. Since its inception, the Plenary Council has held a national Listening and Dialogue phase, and a Listening and Discernment phase. The first planned assemblies were to be held in Adelaide in October 2020, and in Sydney in mid-2021, was re-scheduled due to COVID. Assembly 1 will be held in an online, multi-modal format from October 2-10, 2021. Assembly 2 is scheduled to be held in Sydney on July 4-9, 2022. In the lead-up to the first assembly, parishioners and others are invited to attend a Preparation day for the Plenary Council, in either Launceston or Hobart. The free events include: Keynote speakers, discussion groups, Lunch is provided. **Due to government COVID guidelines, each person wishing to attend a preparation day event, must register before attending. Please bring your ticket with you to the event. Due to the State Election on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> May, the decision has been made to move to the 8<sup>th</sup> May and to be held at Guilford Young College, 10am – 2.30pm.**
