IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHANGING GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS FROM MAY 1ST PARISHIONERS WILL BE ENCOURAGED TO USE OUR UNIQUE GOVERNMENT ASSIGNED QR CODE WHEN ENTERING THE CHURCH FOR MASS AND OTHER VISITS. SO IF YOU HAVE A MOBILE PHONE PLEASE DOWNLOAD THE CHECK-IN TAS APP FROM THE APP STORE. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE A MOBILE PHONE OR CAN-NOT DOWNLOAD THE APP YOU MAY CONTINUE TO CHECK-IN VIA OUR CURRENT SIGN-IN SYSTEM. AS WITH OTHER CHANGES THIS MAY TAKE A FEW WEEKS TO BECOME PRACTICE AND FURTHER GUIDELINES MAYBE GIVEN.

DURING MASS

AS FROM THE WEEKEND 24/25 APRIL PARISHIONERS MAY STAND AND KNEEL AT THE APPROPRIATE TIMES DURING THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST.

HOLY COMMUNION WILL BE BROUGHT TO YOU BY THE CELEBRANT OR EUCHARISTIC MINISTER.

HOLY COMMUNION WILL BE BROUGHT TO YOU WHILE SEATED. The host will be placed on your hand and not on the tongue in keeping with health regulations.

These requirements may change in keeping with Government regulations.

For weekdays the maximum number of people who can be in the main body of the church at any one time is 74. Bookings are not required for weekdays.

PREPARATION DAY FOR THE PLENARY COUNCIL: In 2018, a decision was made to hold a Plenary Council in Australia. Since its inception, the Plenary Council has held a national Listening and Dialogue phase, and a Listening and Discernment phase. The first planned assemblies were to be held in Adelaide in October 2020, and in Sydney in mid-2021, was re-scheduled due to COVID. Assembly 1 will be held in an online, multi-modal format from October 2-10, 2021. Assembly 2 is scheduled to be held in Sydney on July 4-9, 2022. In the lead-up to the first assembly, parishioners and others are invited to attend a Preparation day for the Plenary Council, in either Launceston or Hobart. The free events include: Keynote speakers, discussion groups, Lunch is provided. **Due to government COVID guidelines, each person wishing to attend a preparation day event, must register before attending. Please bring your ticket with you to the event. Due to the State Election on Saturday 1st May, the decision has been made to move to the 8th May and to be held at Guilford Young College, 10am – 2.30pm.**
