CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY INTO ST JOSEPHS CHURCH – IF YOU ARE JUST VISITING PLEASE

SANITISE YOUR HANDS.

NEW CHECK IN TAS INFORMATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS FROM 31ST JULY.
YOU MUST CHECK IN EVERY TIME NO MATTER HOW SHORT YOUR VISIT. EACH INDIVIDUAL AGED OVER 16 MUST CHECK IN USING THE CHECK IN TAS APP OR BY CHECKING IN VIA OUR CURRENT SIGN IN SYSTEM. SO IF YOU HAVE A MOBILE PHONE PLEASE DOWNLOAD THE CHECK-IN TAS APP FROM THE APP STORE. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE A MOBILE PHONE OR CAN-NOT DOWNLOAD THE APP YOU MAY CONTINUE TO CHECK-IN VIA OUR CURRENT SIGN-IN SYSTEM. AS WITH OTHER CHANGES THIS MAY TAKE A FEW WEEKS TO BECOME PRACTICE AND FURTHER GUIDELINES MAYBE GIVEN.

ONCE YOU HAVE COMPLETED THE QR CODE CHECK IN YOU WILL NEED TO SHOW THE “WELCOMER” THE APP SCREEN SHOWING YOU HAVE SUCCESSFULLY CHECKED IN.

FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL VISITORS PLEASE MAINTAIN THE COVID -19 SOCIAL DISTANCING OF 1.5 METRES.

From the Tasmanian Government Website: Organisers of large seated gatherings will be able to apply to increase their audience capacity to 100% from 1 May 2021.

The ease in restrictions from the current 75% cap will mean increased capacity at a range of seated venues including theatres, cinemas, places of worship and sports grounds.

Under the revised restrictions, gatherings under 250 people indoors and 1,000 outdoors, from 1 May will be allowed to go to the seating capacity of the venue or 250 people, whichever is fewer. This applies to cinemas, concert venues, theatres, places of worship and places at which a funeral is being carried out.

Staff employed at the premises, or service attendants, clergy and choir members at places of worship are not included in the gathering numbers.

All venues should continue to remind all attendees of the need to maintain COVID-19 safe behaviours including maintaining 1.5m physical distancing where possible, washing and sanitising hands, staying home and arranging testing if experiencing cold or flu like symptoms and covering coughs or sneezes.

Venues also still require a COVID-19 Safety Plan and contact tracing is required. From 1 May the Check In TAS app must be used for contact tracing purposes. If an attendee cannot use this app, they may be checked in by another attendee who can, or by the gathering organiser, or on a paper-based record managed by the organisers.

DURING MASS

AS FROM THE WEEKEND 24/25 APRIL PARISHIONERS MAY STAND AND KNEEL AT THE APPROPRIATE TIMES DURING THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST.

HOLY COMMUNION WILL BE GIVEN TO YOU BY THE CELEBRANT OR THE EUCHARISTIC MINISTER FROM THE FRONT OF THE CHURCH. The host will be placed on your hand and not on the tongue in keeping with health regulations.

SETS OF ENVELOPES for the New Financial Year 2021/2022 are available. If you are making contributions through the envelope system your new set can be collected from the Monastery after making arrangements with Denise or Gail during office hours on 6234 4866. For record keeping purposes we allocate the envelope number that you are currently using for this financial year. This enables us to issue receipts at the end of each financial year to those people who have provided us with their name and address. We have several anonymous contributors who ideally need a number so that we can accurately declare the number of people contributing to our parish finances. If you contribute by internet banking continue to do so using your current envelope number. This enables you to use the envelopes if you choose to do so in the future.

A NEW STAINED-GLASS WINDOW FOR ST JOSEPH'S? Over recent months the Parish Pastoral Council has been investigating the possibility of commissioning and installing a new stained-glass window for St Joseph's to celebrate the Passionists' stewardship of the parish, to balance the existing windows and to continue this longstanding tradition of church enhancement. The plan would be to include a new window above the confessionals (with appropriate modification to the existing frame) which would match in size the present window above the sacristy and balance those on the opposite side of the church body. Unfortunately, quoted costs are far beyond the parish's existing fundraising capabilities. An alternative approach is to canvas interest across the parish community with a view towards bequests or perhaps contributions to a trust dedicated to this purpose.
