CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY INTO ST JOSEPHS CHURCH – IF YOU ARE JUST VISITING PLEASE

SANITISE YOUR HANDS.

NEW CHECK IN TAS INFORMATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS FROM 31ST JULY.
YOU MUST CHECK IN EVERY TIME NO MATTER HOW SHORT YOUR VISIT. EACH INDIVIDUAL AGED OVER 16 MUST CHECK IN USING THE CHECK IN TAS APP OR BY CHECKING IN VIA OUR CURRENT SIGN IN SYSTEM. SO IF YOU HAVE A MOBILE PHONE PLEASE DOWNLOAD THE CHECK-IN TAS APP FROM THE APP STORE. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE A MOBILE PHONE OR CAN-NOT DOWNLOAD THE APP YOU MAY CONTINUE TO CHECK-IN VIA OUR CURRENT SIGN-IN SYSTEM. AS WITH OTHER CHANGES THIS MAY TAKE A FEW WEEKS TO BECOME PRACTICE AND FURTHER GUIDELINES MAYBE GIVEN.

ONCE YOU HAVE COMPLETED THE QR CODE CHECK IN YOU WILL NEED TO SHOW THE “WELCOMER” THE APP SCREEN SHOWING YOU HAVE SUCCESSFULLY CHECKED IN.

FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL VISITORS PLEASE MAINTAIN THE COVID -19 SOCIAL DISTANCING OF 1.5 METRES.

From the Tasmanian Government Website: Organisers of large seated gatherings will be able to apply to increase their audience capacity to 100% from 1 May 2021.

The ease in restrictions from the current 75% cap will mean increased capacity at a range of seated venues including theatres, cinemas, places of worship and sports grounds.

Under the revised restrictions, gatherings under 250 people indoors and 1,000 outdoors, from 1 May will be allowed to go to the seating capacity of the venue or 250 people, whichever is fewer. This applies to cinemas, concert venues, theatres, places of worship and places at which a funeral is being carried out.

Staff employed at the premises, or service attendants, clergy and choir members at places of worship are not included in the gathering numbers.

All venues should continue to remind all attendees of the need to maintain COVID-19 safe behaviours including maintaining 1.5m physical distancing where possible, washing and sanitising hands, staying home and arranging testing if experiencing cold or flu like symptoms and covering coughs or sneezes.

Venues also still require a COVID-19 Safety Plan and contact tracing is required. From 1 May the Check In TAS app must be used for contact tracing purposes. If an attendee cannot use this app, they may be checked in by another attendee who can, or by the gathering organiser, or on a paper-based record managed by the organisers.

DURING MASS

AS FROM THE WEEKEND 24/25 APRIL PARISHIONERS MAY STAND AND KNEEL AT THE APPROPRIATE TIMES DURING THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST.

HOLY COMMUNION WILL BE GIVEN TO YOU BY THE CELEBRANT OR THE EUCHARISTIC MINISTER FROM THE FRONT OF THE CHURCH. The host will be placed on your hand and not on the tongue in keeping with health regulations.

For record keeping purposes we allocate the envelope number that you are currently using for this financial year. This enables us to issue receipts at the end of each financial year to those people who have provided us with their name and address. We have several anonymous contributors who ideally need a number so that we can accurately declare the number of people contributing to our parish finances. If you contribute by internet banking continue to do so using your current envelope number. This enables you to use the envelopes if you choose to do so in the future.

CHRISTMAS HAMPERS 2021: Our hampers this year will provide some on-going support for refugee families and individuals who are struggling to provide food for their table during this Christmas Season. The Christmas Hamper appeal is organised by our Parish Refugee Outreach Group. **There is a leaving collection this Sunday 21st November** to help with the hamper preparation. As occurred last year, because of the COVID-19 pandemic impact on our parish routine and financial situation, it has again been decided to provide just the FOOD hamper which could include, say, a bright, coloured table cloth and or table centre piece, serviette rings, etc. **The Christmas Hamper List** is now on the notice board at the rear of the church. As in previous years families, or groups of parishioners are asked to take one of the tickets and make up a Christmas hamper for that nominated family or individual. We recognise that creating a hamper can be a costly exercise so it is suggested that several parishioners may group together and contribute to the hamper. St John Ambulance training in CPR and in the use of St Joseph's AED (Automated External Defibrillator) equipment. Training will be held on **Wednesday 24th November from 1 to 5pm in the Side Chapel** and will be conducted by St John instructors, there are still 3 vacancies available. St John Ambulance is an accredited Australian Vocational Education and Training (VET) provider and will issue a nationally recognised certificate for the course you will be undertaking. To be eligible for that certificate, however, you need to have a **USI (Unique Student Identifier)** which will allow you to be registered in the national database.

St Joseph's Catholic Church is the primary contact for providing Catholic rites and sacraments – **Fr. Justin as Catholic Chaplain to the RHH can be contacted on (03) 62344866**. The RHH Chaplaincy service is maintaining a 24/7 on-call service for staff, patients and visitors who would like to talk to them or need some informal support.
