**"THE PURSUIT OF A MORAL LIFE: sharing and building our faith community"**: an evening of reflection and discussion with our own Father Brendan, preceded by light refreshments, **Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> September 6 – 8pm, St Joseph's Side Chapel.**

Christianity has been a significant contributor to the universal discussion regarding the moral life. The "golden rule" of treating others as you want to be treated is a maxim with biblical foundations (Matthew 7:12) and one that can be found in many faiths and cultural philosophies and indeed well beyond the parameters of Christianity. Christianity's more specific approach to the moral life is guided and enlivened by the incarnation. When speaking about the moral life we are speaking of our human life, and the question of what it is to be human relates directly to the humanity of Jesus. Jesus shows us how to be human and in the practising of this "humanness" we journey toward morality. While this may seem simple and clear, the fact is that life can be messy and variables beyond our control as well as our own inadequacies can interfere with our desire to be human/moral. We are formed and nurtured in communities so the pursuit of the moral life is not a private journey. Join us for this parish evening about sharing our accrued wisdom and building our faith community.
